

# Now you can get a COVID test and treatment at the same time!

## The Biden-Harris Administration Test to Treat initiative.

Through this program, if you test positive your health provider can prescribe you with oral antivirals if the treatment is appropriate for you.

### Here Are The Steps For How This Program Works



#### STEP 1

##### Get Tested

Get tested for COVID-19 at a Test to Treat site or get tested at home or pharmacy and bring your test results to your health care provider.

#### STEP 2

##### Get a Prescription

If you test positive for COVID and are at high risk for getting very sick, ask your provider if you are eligible for a prescription for COVID-19 treatment"



#### STEP 3

##### Get Treated

Fill your prescription at a local pharmacy to begin your treatment.





Two treatments are available: **Paxlovid (Pfizer)** and **Lagevrio (molnupiravir) (Merck)**.

### **Paxlovid (Pfizer)**

Paxlovid will be available to people who:

- Tested positive for COVID-19 and have not yet been admitted to the hospital
- Are high risk for developing severe COVID-19
- Are 12 years of age or older (and at least 88 pounds)

### **Lagevrio (molnupiravir) (Merck)**

Lagevrio will be available to people who:

- Tested positive for COVID-19 and have not yet been admitted to the hospital
- Are high risk for developing severe COVID-19
- Have no alternative FDA-authorized COVID-19 treatment options available, or clinically appropriate, for them.
- Are 18 years of age or older

## What are Oral Antivirals?

Oral antivirals are medicines taken by mouth that help **YOU** body fight off viruse.

These types of medicine help your body prevent COVID-19 from multiplying inside of you and lowers the amount of virus in your body. Oral antivirals reduce serious COVID-19 infection symptoms and lowers the chances of your illness getting worse and needing hospitalization."



## What if I do not Qualify for an Oral Antiviral Treatment?

If you do not meet the eligibility criteria, or have a health condition that is not suitable for the oral antiviral treatment, you may be eligible to receive a different different such as monoclonal antibodies or you can join a clinical trial.
